As I write this we are on the verge of Covid restrictions being lifted. Whilst I am sure many of us are feeling excited and relieved many are also feeling anxious and cautious. One thing I am certainly looking forward to is being able to sing together in church again. It has been one of the things I have missed most during lockdown.

Singing hymns together in church is not only a matter of us individually praising our maker but also an act of unity. It is something we do together regardless of how good we are at holding a tune. It has given rise to the expression "*singing from the same hymn sheet*". We have over the last few months, weather permitting, gone outside to sing a final hymn which has been uplifting.

Hymns express in popular and memorable ways some of the deepest truths about God and our relationship with Him. One that regularly makes the top 10 is "***Dear Lord and Father of mankind***". ## TALES FROM PINSLA GARDEN

### Seed collecting

At Pinsla we find ***Omphalodes nitida*** is a reliable perennial for making a sky blue carpet in the shade, but we need lots more. It is easy from fresh seed but deciding when to collect the seed can be confusing. They need collecting when they are still green or they drop off. If you feel along a stem each spent flower feels hard, like it might be a seed, but look closely, under a microscope and you see each capsule contains 4 carpels (I think) that clasp individual seeds, as the ovary opens, the comb-like clasps release the seeds leaving a hard receptacle.





Hello everyone! My name is **Caroline Bailey** and I'm the new lay worker at Millpool Methodist Chapel. It's a pleasure to be sharing in your Community Magazine – I've really enjoyed reading the last couple of copies since starting, and as gardening, music, ceramics and pilates are some of my interests I see I will be well served by your community and kept very busy if I join everything going!

I moved to Cornwall in Summer 2019 and now live in Quoit near St Columb with my husband David and our 12 year old daughter. We run a small holiday let in our garden, so are getting a dab hand at a 'covid deep clean!... if only it extended into our house! Our 21 year old son has just graduated from Portsmouth Uni and we have wider family in Peterborough and Yorkshire.

I grew up, lived and worked in Orpington. Kentish villages and countryside were on our doorstep. I was part of an Anglican church and involved in many aspects of local church and community life. My background is in primary teaching and as our family grew, I combined working part time as a music teacher in primary schools with working as a freelance ceramic artist occasionally running school or church exterior mosaic projects. I have also worked with a Christian charity, taking lessons, assemblies and exploring R.E through the Arts.

I trained as a Licensed Lay Minister in the CofE from 2013-2017. Using the creative arts as a way to explore life, faith and spirituality with all ages is something I love, often using ceramics, writing, music or movement as a tool for this. I believe that people of all faiths and no faith can come together to build community and grow places of love and support. We holidayed regularly in Cornwall since our honeymoon here in 1993, including 12 years camping as a family near St Just, come rain or shine! Through my husband's love of surfing, we got involved at Tubestation, Polzeath and I exhibit some of my ceramics in the gallery there. I started with the Methodist 'Bodmin, Padstow and Wadebridge Circuit' as a part-time school's worker just before the pandemic and was then promptly furloughed and plunged into home-schooling our daughter. I think it was a shock for both of us, although we enjoyed the more relaxed routine!

After returning after furlough, I now combine some Lay Pastoral work at Millpool, Bodmin and Lanivet Methodist Chapels with some school's work as schools begin to reopen to visitors. This means that I will be around more at Millpool and I look forward to being part of the community here.

# Cardinham Parish Hall Events

The hall is available for hire, but there will be some restrictions. There needs to be a large enough gap between bookings if held on the same day so that the hall can be checked that it has been cleaned and tidied after each use. It will be the hirer who has the responsibility that the hall is left exactly as they found it, cleaned, floors swept (this does include the toilet areas) and rubbish collected put outside in the bin etc.

Please continue to use the hand sanitiser provided when entering the building. There is a dispenser on the wall to the left as you enter the building and more inside the hall.

We have been advised to continue to provide the NHS QR code poster for track and trace and also the logbook of attendees if the QR code is not used.

If you are an organised group and know who your attendees are and have your own list then it only needs to be the organiser to sign in then they will be contacted to let everyone else know if they need to self isolate through the track and trace system. If for example it's a coffee morning then everyone should either scan in or sign in.

Now that the restrictions are lifting, we would ask that everyone still be mindful of others, consider still wearing a mask in the hall, especially if there are many people and it's not so easy to distance yourself. If you feel unwell in any way please stay home.

If the Covid 19 rules change again then obviously we will review and change things as required.

**EXTENSION UPDATE:** Our Application to the Cally Barrett Wind Turbine was successful and we were grateful to receive £2050.00 which has covered the cost of the tiler who laid all the new floor tiles in the extension. We are waiting on the delivery of the internal doors and then the carpenter can make a start on the door frames, doors and skirting boards. As with many items at the moment there is a supply and manufacturing delay.





# This Farming Life - Bodmin Moor Style

## 12th June

Visiting the family in Yorkshire was full of the usual fun and events. We emptied Mum's garden shed and took the contents to the tip.

The shed had limped along through the previous two winters, threatening to collapse on several occasions. So the decision was taken that it had suffered enough, and it was humanely dispatched with the help of a large axe and a chainsaw. My brother started asking if it was "chainsaw time?" at 08.30am, but being a bank holiday weekend I managed to hold chainsaw time back until 9.00am. Once the debris was removed, we broke up the concrete base and carted that away in two trailer loads.

We managed to avoid the bank holiday crowds by planning a riverside walk near the sewage farm (another family favourite) and the icing on the cake was filling the garden waste bin to capacity with hedge trimmings. Us Northerners know how to have a good time!

## 19th June

The sheep are skipping around like happy youngsters since they were sheared last week. It's the first time we've seen our new ram without his clothes on, and he is a fine figure of a sheep. The wool is piled up in a bag, sadly it has very little commercial value, despite being a wonderful natural resource. Maybe the time will come when it is a premium product again, but perhaps not within my farming career.

For only the second time in over ten years a hedgehog has been seen on the farm. In my younger days they were commonplace, but now it is a rare treat to see one. I am hoping it was a female and there might be a family on the way. Also hoping all the baby hedgehogs are born head first, otherwise it might be off the scale of maternal discomfort!



## 1st July

It's silly season on the farm, with lots of crops reaching their peak. We're hoping for a spell of good weather to make hay and pick soft fruit. Wild strawberries are ripening in the hedgerows, a little treat to be eaten while walking the dog.

A young fox cub was having the time of his life ambling through my fields without a care in the world, I watched him for ages before he realised I was there and bolted for the hedge. He is welcome to stay as long as he likes so long as his diet consists of rabbit rather than chicken or lamb. I will stick a menu to the gate post, that'll clarify things.



### 3rd July

We're eagerly awaiting the return of dry weather so we can make some hay. Weather watching is a continual preoccupation for farmers, and it's not about to change. I compare weather conditions with my Mum in Yorkshire over the phone on a daily basis. My brother has been helping our cousins bring in their hay, so they are ahead of us in filling the barns ready for winter. There's no better sight than a trailer stacked high with sweet smelling hay bales, knowing that your livestock will have plenty to eat in the winter. Our Great Uncle used to tell us about horse drawn hay making, they had a cart horse who was so reliable that she didn't need anyone to go with her on the journey between the hay field and the barn. She would faithfully plod from one to the other, drawing the load to the barn, where someone would be waiting to meet her and unload, then returning to the field for more. Those days are now gone, but there's still a joyful camaraderie when working together to complete the harvest.

### 10th July



The pigs have made the transition from "cute" to "boisterous" in a matter of weeks, and there's no going back. They know when it's nearly tea time, and wait by the gate, drooling. Then it's game on. My goal is to get most of the food in the trough, theirs is to trip me up and ambush the feed bucket at all costs.

Perhaps the England football squad would benefit from this as part of their training. You might not be so quick to dive to the floor if it meant being trampled by half a dozen hungry porkers. But fair play to the national team, they've done well to reach the finals, and we wish them the best of luck.

### 24th July

So much harvesting has taken place in the heatwave, for some, the days must have been a blur. Hot, prickly, dusty, but oh so satisfying. The loft is full, the barn smells of sweet dried grass, the winter feed is secure, we can relax. The blisters on our hands after flinging bales around will have plenty of time to heal, and the joy of another successful haytime will stay with us.

The abundance of young birds everywhere reveals that it must have been a good breeding season. There are dozens of young chaffinch, goldfinch, siskins, sparrows and blackbirds about. The latter seem to be learning how to get into the fruit cage and benefit from our carefully grown fruit. The heat has brought out dozens of butterflies and 'The Big Butterfly Count' which is now on, may be in for a record year if the warmth and sunshine continue.

## CORNISH SAFFRON BUNS (From Cornwall Guide)

Rich yeast buns, coloured a vivid yellow with fresh saffron and loaded with currants; **saffron buns** are a staple in bakeries throughout Cornwall, alongside their bigger brother the *saffron loaf*. The delicately flavoured, 'cake' can be enjoyed sliced and spread with butter, toasted or fresh\*, though many a Cornishman or woman will attest that they are best simply, unadorned and delicious.

In the 1800s, the treat of a saffron bun was incorporated into the outings organized by the church or the Methodist chapel in villages across the county. On Feast Days the village band would lead the people, often a procession of children from the Sunday School bearing religious banners, to a nearby field or beach. Games and races were often an integral part of the day, but ubiquitous was an especially large saffron bun, commonly known as the tea treat bun, which was given to each child. Some villages have continued or resurrected this tradition, **Pendeen** in Penwith being a case in point, and nearby bakers **Warrens** sell them in all their outlets.

The ingredient which makes them special is, of course, the saffron and any colouring substitute just wouldn't have the same effect of richness of colour and flavour. To obtain a single ounce of saffron, the stamens of literally thousands of crocus flowers must be harvested, making it the dearest spice in terms of weight. No surprise then that, to exclaim the expense of something, the Cornish coined the phrase '*dear as saffron*'. Native of Southwest Asia, and popularly used in much Mediterranean and Asian cooking, one may well ask how it became essential to a traditional Cornish recipe. The answer probably lies in Cornwall's ancient tin trade with the Phoenicians, where the spice and also the flower bulbs would sometimes be exchanged for the metal.

## CARDYNHAM CHURCH

From the high ground all around Cardinham you can see the church tower. Have you ever wondered why almost all our churches have a tower? When parishes were set up in the early Middle Ages, there were two essentials to show that a church was a parish church with its rights and privileges - a bell and a font. The bell or bells were rung to announce a service.

Even when I was a child in the suburban 1960's as I made my last minute way to church, I knew I was still in time if the bell was still ringing and late if it stopped before I arrived! Bells were rung in welcome, in times of rejoicing and times of mourning. In the famous Dorothy Sayers detective novel '*The Nine Tailors*', the nine tailors were the number of times the church bell rang to announce the death of a man in the village. From the 1570s, bells were rung to mark the anniversary of each monarch's accession to the throne, and to celebrate deliverance from national danger. A vicar could be disciplined if he didn't ring his bells to welcome the bishop when he visited. During the World War II, church bells were not rung at all as it was the signal that we had been invaded.

Bells don't last forever, they crack, they go out of tune and have to be recast. As taking them any distance would have been very expensive, the casting was often done in the church. Not everyone enjoyed the sound of bells. People complained about "disorderly" ringing. Some even complained about bells being left "rung up" (meaning 'ready to ring') and ringing by themselves all night or the wind blowing them down. "*Change ringing*" (ringing bells according to a mathematical pattern developed in the late 17th century), didn't take off in Cornwall until much later.

Athelstan Coode, the vicar of Cardinham for a tragically short time in the late 19th century, was an enthusiastic ringer and responsible for us retaining our tower. When he arrived in the parish the tower was unsafe. He started a subscription list raising £400 in 6 months by letters and personal visits, which was half the cost. He gave the rest himself. The tower was taken down as far as tops of the windows. The bells were re-hung and 3 new added. He formed a hand bell class to train ringers

for the re-hung bells. On 24th November 1896 the work was finished. The Bishop came to preach; no danger of Athelstan Coode being disciplined for not ringing his bells - 5040 changes were rung after the service. The vicar took the tenor bell himself. This was the second peal ever rung in Cornwall. The first was at Penzance. Today we still have a team of ringers who ring for special occasions including when the Duke of Edinburgh died. If you hear the bells, think of all the generations in Cardinham who have heard them before you, and when you look across at the tower think of the changes across the centuries it has seen.

This is an opportunity for a [community group](#) to bid for assistance with a project or equipment that would benefit the community as a whole. Please do contact me if you are a community group and would like to be considered for this.

The summer holidays are upon us, and restrictions about to be lifted. The vaccination programme has given solid protection, and I hope very much we will be able to return to a more normal and relaxed mode of living. Quite apart from the tragic loss of life this pandemic has, without doubt, caused a great deal of mental health issues, living under such restrained circumstances for so long can never be a good thing.
